POLICE BLOTTER-April 2017

On April 8, police responded to a neighbor dispute. A resident verbally disciplined a neighbor's child, which upset the neighbor. The neighbor approached the resident and warned her about yelling at her child. The neighbor reported feeling threatened because the resident's husband was holding a landscaping tool, and mentioned she possessed a gun. The situation was resolved and no charges were filed.

On April 10, police responded to a report of credit card fraud. The resident stated she got an alert from her bank stating her card was being used. She cancelled the card and followed up with her bank.

On April 11, police responded to a property damage report. A large rock was used to puncture a hole in the siding of a building.

On April 11, an officer who was investigating an accident learned that the at-fault vehicle had just been stolen. The operator was also under the influence of a controlled substance and alcohol. He was arrested and taken to jail. The vehicle was returned to the rightful owner.

On April 13, a resident reported his personal information was used to obtain a payroll advance loan. A report was furnished to him to forward to the company so they could begin a fraud investigation.

On April 14, a resident reported receiving harassing calls and messages from her ex-boyfriend. There is currently a warrant for his arrest from a prior assault against the resident.

On April 14, police assistance was requested for the case of an elderly male who lived alone and was unable to care for himself. He was found on the floor of his residence, where he stated he had been for several days. Adult Protective Services was eventually contacted and the person was placed in a residential facility.

On April 14, police investigated a hit-skip accident. A driver ran a stop sign and struck another vehicle. The driver then left the scene. However, the impact knocked off his license plate. He was located and charged.

On April 21, police responded to a two-vehicle accident. A driver was exiting a parking lot and struck the rear of a vehicle on the roadway. He was cited for ACDA.

On April 26, police stopped a vehicle for expired tags and discovered that the operator was under several license suspensions. He also had a warrant for his arrest. He was cited for the traffic charges, and turned over to the custody of Franklin County Sheriff's Office.
