POLICE BLOTTER-February 2018

On February 1, police responded to the report of illegal drug activity at a residence. Officers confiscated suspected meth and assorted drug paraphernalia. The drugs are being sent to the state crime lab for analysis, and charges are pending against the suspects.

On February 5, a resident reported receiving a fraudulent check after listing items for sale on a website. The case was forwarded to the FBI due to the check being forged from an out-of-state bank.

On February 5, police responded to a two-vehicle accident. A vehicle slid on ice and into an intersection, and was struck by another car. There were no injuries.

On February 7, police took a report on a restraining order violation from a resident who was repeatedly contacted by her ex-husband. A warrant was issued, and he was placed under arrest.

On February 11, police stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. It was determined that the operator had a suspended license and a warrant for her arrest from Franklin County. She was cited for driving under suspension and transferred to the custody of the Franklin County Sheriff's Office.

On February 15, police responded to a business in regard to threats made by a former employee. The business owner only wanted documentation.

On February 17, a resident reported that a package she was expecting did not arrive. It was learned that FedEx delivered the item to the wrong house number, but the resident at that address denied any knowledge of the package. The victim filed a claim through FedEx.

On February 20, a local business reported that damage was done to the door. It did not appear entry was gained into the business.

On February 24, police responded to a vehicle accident. The operator, who was elderly, was attempting to park and hit her accelerator instead of her brake pedal. She then drove her vehicle into the side of a structure. She was cited for Failure to Control.
