POLICE BLOTTER-June 2018

On June 2, police responded to the report of a missing firearm. The reporting party believed his wife hid the firearm. Contact was made with the wife, who denied any knowledge of its whereabouts.

On June 4, police responded to the report of a vehicle crash. A female motorist pulled from a parking spot into the lane of travel and was hit by a passing vehicle. She was cited for improper starting.

On June 4, police responded to the report of a vehicle crash. A vehicle which was slowing in traffic was struck from behind. That motorist was cited for assured clear distance.

On June 6, police responded to a trespassing call. A resident reported his son and his son's girlfriend showed up at the residence after being told not to return. Officers advised them they would be charged for criminal trespass if they came back again.

On June 14, police impounded an abandoned vehicle after the owner moved away and left the vehicle behind.

On June 18, police responded to a domestic dispute between a resident, her adult daughter, and her son's girlfriend. The daughter and the other female agreed to leave the residence and no charges were filed.

On June 19, police responded to a domestic dispute between a husband and wife. The wife stated that her husband had locked her out of the residence. Police attempted to make contact with the husband, but he refused to answer the door. The wife was advised that the police were not permitted to force entry on her behalf. She decided to stay at another location for the night.

On June 19, an officer spotted a wanted individual working at a local business. The individual ran from deputies the previous day when they attempted to arrest him on a warrant. The officer radioed for backup and the individual was placed under arrest by police and deputies. He was found to be in possession of heroin at the time of his arrest. Deputies took custody of the individual and transported him to jail.

On June 20, police responded to a vehicle accident. A Rumpke garbage truck traveled left of center and struck an oncoming vehicle, which was destroyed by the impact. The operator escaped injury. The garbage truck operator was cited for failure to control.

On June 21,resident reported that his family had been receiving messages from a male who had been having an affair with his wife. The wife stated that she had ended things with the male, who was a co-worker, but that he continued to harass her. The report was forwarded to the prosecutor for consideration of charges.

On June 24,police were dispatched on the report of drug activity. Police located the parties involved and discovered them to be in possession of crystal meth, syringes, and a digital scale. One person was arrested for felony drug possession.

On June 26,police attempted to pull over a car for an equipment violation. The operator attempted to drive down an alley and hide behind a house, but was located. A K-9 was requested to respond to the scene, leading to the discovery of drug paraphernalia in the car. The motorist was charged for the paraphernalia and for having fictitious tags.

On June 26, police responded to a vehicle crash. AN elderly female crashed into the rear of a parked car. She suffered a broken wrist and some cuts. She was transported to the hospital by medics. She was charged for failure to control.
