WINTER WEATHER POLICY

Purpose:

This Administrative Policy and Procedure outlines the Village's winter weather response plan.

Applicability:

This policy applies to all Village employees involved in snow and ice control operations.

Overview:

The Village takes measures to conserve the use of rock salt for environmental and budgetary reasons. This plan outlines the Village's conservation efforts and sets the level of service provided for snow and ice control operations.

Objective:

The Village's main objective is to conserve the use of rock salt during snow and ice control operations, while still providing a safe driving environment for residents and pass-through traffic. This will require a level of service change from previous winter seasons.

Level of Service:

The following table outlines the Village's level of service for the winter season.

- ¹ The Mayor or Village Administrator will evaluate road conditions during early snow fall events and determine if treatment is appropriate.
- ² The Mayor or Village Administrator will evaluate road conditions and determine if treatment is necessary to maintain traffic at safe speed.

Priority of Streets: Village streets will be plowed in the following order:

Priority 1: Major and through streets

Priority 2: Subdivision entrances and site specific areas.

Priority 3: Secondary streets. (Generally non-through streets) *In subdivisions where the village has not accepted public dedication of the streets, plowing will only be done when a hold-harmless agreement is provided by the developer.*

Priority 4: Cul-de-sacs, dead-end streets and alleys.
