POLICE BLOTTER-November 2017

On November 2, several residents reported that their unlocked vehicles were entered during the overnight hours.

On November 4, several residents reported that their unlocked vehicles were entered during the overnight hours.

On November 4, police responded to the report of a runaway foster child. The juvenile was found in Canal Winchester, and physically resisted being taken into custody. He was examined by medics before being transported to a juvenile detention facility.

On November 7, a resident reported a cell phone being stolen from his vehicle. Using the phone's tracking software, it was discovered in his trash can.

On November 8, police responded to a domestic incident. The male agreed to leave the residence and the female was advised of her options.

On November 8, police responded to the report of an unruly juvenile. The juvenile, who attends a special school in Columbus, admitted to getting off the bus and taking off. He then stole a bicycle. He was located by school officials later that morning. The bicycle was taken for safekeeping, and Columbus Police were notified that it is located at our department. So far, no victims have reported the bike stolen.

On November 9, police took a report of several missing iPads. The victim reported that some computers were stolen from a different location in Carroll. The case has been turned over to the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office for investigation due to there being a suspect in common in both thefts.

On November 14, a resident reported that an online order did not arrive, and he discovered that the shipment was diverted to an address in New Jersey. The same address has been used in the same manner with different victims across the country. The resident was advised to file a report with the FBI.

On November 15, police responded to a domestic incident. Both parties had minor injuries, but officers were unable to determine the primary aggressor, due to conflicting statements. The case was referred to the prosecutor's office.

On November 17, a resident reported that paint had been thrown on her vehicle while it was parked in her driveway.

On November 17, a resident reported receiving mail containing a cartoon drawing of a person with x's for eyes and an arrow through the head. The resident reported his wife had been cheating on him and the other man may be responsible for the drawing.

On November 20, police responded to the report of a dead body. It was determined that the person took their own life. The Fairfield County Coroner is investigating the death.

On November 27, several residents reported that their houses were egged. A suspect was identified, and charges were forwarded to the Juvenile Prosecutor.

On November 29, a resident reported that her cell phone and purse were stolen from an unlocked building. The items were later located along the road, but cash was missing from the purse.
