POLICE BLOTTER-October 2017

On October 4, a political candidate reported that his campaign signs had been improperly removed. The signs were later returned.

On October 4, a resident reported receiving correspondence from her ex-husband, who was prohibited from contacting her due to a protection order. The ex-husband was charged with violating the protection order and a warrant was issued for his arrest.

On October 5, police responded to the report of an accident. A vehicle struck a deer in the roadway, causing moderate damage. The deer was killed by the impact.

On October 5, police responded to the report of an accident. A vehicle stopped in traffic was struck from behind, causing minor damage to both vehicles. The at-fault operator was charged for failing to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

On October 6, a resident reported that juveniles had written their names in freshly poured concrete in his driveway. The mother of one of the juveniles offered to reimburse the company for repairs.

On October 8, police stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. Both occupants were under then influence of alcohol and neither had a valid driver's license. The operator had several warrants for his arrest out of Franklin County, and it was determined he did not have permission to have the vehicle he was driving. The operator and passenger were both arrested at that time.

On October 12, police stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. The operator did not have any identification on him. He gave the officer his name, which was verified by his passenger. It was determined that the operator gave the officer a fake name, and that he had a suspended license and warrants for his arrest. The passenger also admitted to lying about the driver's identity. A search of the vehicle also turned up a pipe with marijuana residue. Both occupants were arrested and transported to jail.

On October 13, officers went to a residence to execute an arrest warrant. The resident came to the door, and when she was advised she was being arrested, she went back inside and locked her door. Officers were able to find a different door that was unlocked, at which time they entered the residence and located the female. She was arrested for the warrant and for resisting arrest, and transported to jail.

On October 18, several residents of the Stoney Bluff and Rolling Acres subdivisions reported that their unlocked cars were entered during the overnight hours. All of the residents reported that loose change and cash were missing.

On October 20, police responded to a domestic assault. It was determined that the female resident struck her boyfriend with a metal pole, causing visible injuries. She was arrested and transported to jail.

On October 23, a resident reported that his girlfriend's brother intentionally damaged his car by slamming his fist into the hood. The brother was charged with criminal damaging.

On October 24, police observed a vehicle being driven by a female they were familiar with, and knew her license was suspended. The officer initiated a traffic stop at that time. It was determined that

the female also had warrants for her arrest. She was cited for the suspended license, and transported to jail on the warrants.

On October 26, a resident reported that her parked car had its driver side mirror knocked off. Police found remnants of the mirror belonging to the car that struck the vehicle, but have no suspects at this time.

On October 30, police responded to the report of a suicidal juvenile. The juvenile was taken into custody and was transported to the hospital for evaluation.
