POLICE BLOTTER-September 2016

On September 5, police responded to an injury accident. A vehicle made a left turn in front of an oncoming vehicle, causing a collision. The female driver suffered a severely fractured wrist, as well as other injuries. The other motorist was cited for Failure to Yield. Both vehicles were total losses.

On September 5, an officer was alerted to an intoxicated driver. The officer located the vehicle and observed moving violations. The officer conducted a traffic stop and determined that the operator was intoxicated. He was booked into the Fairfield County Jail.

On September 5, police responded to a criminal damaging report. A resident reported seeing two juveniles place something in his mailbox, which then exploded. The juveniles admitted their involvement, and their parent was advised of the incident. The parent agreed to compensate the resident for any damages.

On September 7, police began an investigation of employee theft at a local business. The investigation is ongoing.

On September 13, police were notified by a resident who discovered a discarded purse while he was out walking. The officer contacted the owner of the purse, who reported it had been stolen from her car overnight. The investigation was transferred to the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office, as the victim lived outside the Lithopolis jurisdiction, and was one of several thefts in the area the night before.

On September 18, police were dispatched to a medical center on the report of an overdose that occurred in the Village. It was determined a female juvenile had taken prescription medicine which she had stolen from her father. A report was forwarded to the County Prosecutor for consideration of charges, and to Child Protective Services.

On September 24, police were dispatched to a residence on the report of drug paraphernalia being discovered in the garage. The items were confiscated and a report was forwarded to the Prosecutor.
